

LOCAL LAW ___ OF 2020

AMENDING CHAPTER 213 OF THE IRVINGTON CODE (VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC)

TO PROVIDE FOR LOCAL BUSINESS VEHICLE PARKING PERMITS

(February 24, 2020)

Be it enacted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Irvington that Chapter 213, Vehicles and Traffic, of the Irvington Code is amended as follows:

Section 1: A new Article VIIB is hereby added to Chapter 213, to read as follows:

ARTICLE VIIB

Local Business Vehicle Parking Permits

§ 213-29.9. Definitions.

As used in this article, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

LOCAL BUSINESS – A business that has its principal office or place of business in the Restricted Parking Zone.

LOCAL BUSINESS VEHICLE – A commercial vehicle used in connection with a Local Business.

RESTRICTED PARKING ZONE - The Main Street area, more specifically those streets generally bounded on the easterly side by North and South Dearman Street, on the northerly side by Matthiessen Park, on the westerly side by North and South Astor Street and the Metro-North Commuter Railroad tracks, and on the southerly side by Station Road.

VILLAGE CLERK – The Village Clerk of Irvington.

§ 213-29.10. Eligibility, fees, placement, limitations.

- A. The Village Clerk or designee may issue up to two Local Business Vehicle Parking Permits for vehicles used in the Local Business upon submission of proof that the applicant owns a Local Business, as defined above.
- B. The fee for a Local Business Vehicle Parking Permit shall be set from time to time by the Board of Trustees, with each permit valid for the year

February 1 to January 31. Said permit must be renewed annually. The fees that are collected by the Village for such permits shall be credited to the general fund.

- C. If the Local Business moves its principal office or place out of business out of the Restricted Parking Area, the Local Business Vehicle Parking Permit automatically expires. It shall be the Local Business's responsibility to return the Local Business Vehicle Parking Permits to the Village Clerk.
- D. A Local Business Vehicle Parking Permit shall be placed on the rearview mirror.
- E. No Local Business or employee of a Local Business shall give or sell a Local Business Vehicle Parking Permit to someone not employed by the Local Business. Any Local Business whose employee violates this subsection shall be liable for a fine as set from time to time by the Board of Trustees, shall have such Local Business Vehicle Parking Permit revoked, and shall not be entitled to be issued a new Local Business Vehicle Parking Permit for a period of one year after such revocation.
- F. Vehicles with more than four wheels are prohibited from obtaining a Local Business Vehicle Parking Permit.
- G. A Local Business Vehicle Parking Permit permits parking on the streets listed in § 213-10.1.
- H. A vehicle displaying a Local Business Vehicle Parking Permit must comply with all posted time and day restrictions on parking.

§ 213-29.11. Revocation or refusal of Local Business Vehicle Parking Permits for scofflaws.

- A. For purposes of this section, a "scofflaw" shall be an individual, corporation or other entity that has three or more outstanding and unpaid parking violations issued by the Village of Irvington against him/her/it or any vehicle registered in his/her/its name for which a warrant or final notice of such violations has been mailed by or on behalf of the Village of Irvington.
- B. The Village may revoke the Local Business Vehicle Parking Permit of any Local Business that is listed on the records of the Village as a scofflaw. The Village Clerk shall provide notice of such revocation, and the

effective date of such revocation shall be the date of such notice. Such notice shall provide that the Local Business Vehicle Parking Permit holder shall return the parking permit to the Village Clerk.

- C. A Local Business that has had its parking permit revoked may apply for and be issued a new Local Business Vehicle Parking Permit if it provides evidence that all outstanding parking tickets issued in its name or in the name of the owner of the vehicle have been paid in full.
- D. No Local Business Vehicle Parking Permit may be issued to any Local Business or owner of a Local Business who is listed on the records of the Village as a scofflaw.

Section 2: All ordinances, local laws, and parts thereof inconsistent with this local law are hereby repealed.

Section 3: This local law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.
